Important Notice

On July 10th, 2006, we will be upgrading our home banking login procedures. The new procedures are designed to increase security and help insure that only you can access your personal information on this site.

Once the login upgrade is in place, you will be asked to set a "Secret Word", add your Email Address, and set up several "Security Questions" that you will be able to choose.

Once you complete this procedure, you will be able to login with your account number and password on future visits. In addition, we will display your "Secret Word" during future visits when we ask you for your password. If you DO NOT see your secret word, you should not login since this would indicate a fraudulent site. You should contact us immediately if this ever happens.

The new login procedure will also make sure you are logging in from your own computer. Most members login from the same computer each time they visit home banking. However, if you use several PC's to access our home banking site, you will be required to enter your email address and answer your security questions each time you login for the first time from a different computer. You may also be challenged for this information if you get a new PC, get a new browser program or clear your cookies on your current PC. As you can see, it is important that you remember the answers to your security questions.

These changes will be implemented on July 10, 2006. We appreciate your patience and ask that you take a minute to set up your account on the new login system. Just follow the online instructions when you log in. As always, if you have questions or concerns, please let us know.

IDENTITY THEFT 911 SOLUTION

With identity theft increasing, Savannah Postal Credit Union now offers the Identity Theft 911 Solution. This is a free service that is provided to our members at no cost to the member.

If you become a victim of identity theft this solution offers:

Fraud alerts immediately placed with credit bureaus

A personal advocate works with you one-on-one, from the first call to the final resolution.

Systematic, lightning-fast notification of relevant agencies

Assistance in filing a police report

Preparation of all needed documents

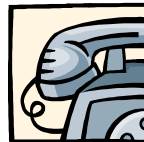

Hurricane Preparedness

Hurricane Watch – Is issued when there is a threat of hurricane conditions within 36 hours

- Fill your car with gas
- Secure buildings
- Review evacuation plan
- Listen to a radio or television for official instructions
- Check your family's emergency supplies
- Bring in outdoor objects (i.e. toys, garden tools).
- Turn refrigerator and freezer to coldest settings.
- Secure outdoor objects which cannot be brought inside (i.e. boats, lawnmower).
- Store drinking water in clean bathtubs, jugs, bottles and cooking utensils.

Hurricane Warning - Is issued when hurricane conditions are expected in 24 hours or less.

- Listen to a radio or television for official instructions.
- If in a mobile home, check tie downs and prepare to evacuate.
- Store valuables and personal papers in a waterproof container
- Stay inside, away from windows, skylights, and glass doors.
- Keep a supply of flashlights and extra batteries handy.
- Avoid open flames, such as candles and kerosene lamps, as a source of light.
- If power is lost, turn off major appliances to reduce power "surge" when electricity is restored.

Evacuating – Please keep in mind that the decision was based on your safety.

- Take blankets and sleeping bags to shelter.
- Tell someone outside of the storm area where you are going.
- Bring pre-assembled emergency supplies and warm protective clothing.
- Leave as soon as possible. Avoid flooded roads and watch for washed-out bridges.
- Lock up home and leave.

Protecting your Family – Develop a Family Disaster Supply Kit if in the event you are effected by an emergency. Your kit may include the following:

- Flashlight and extra batteries
- Portable, battery-operated radio and extra batteries
- First aid kit and manual
- Emergency food and water
- Non-electric can opener
- Essential medicines
- Cash and credit cards
- Sturdy shoes

Protecting Your Home – Your home is your most valuable asset. The information provided serves as a guide to help you protect it.

- Permanent shutters are the best protection. A lower-cost approach is to put up plywood panels. Use at least ½ inch plywood cut to fit each window.
- Pre-drill holes every 18 inches for screws.
- Trim back dead or weak branches from trees.
- Check into flood insurance.

The Aftermath – After the storm hits the area, be alerts and watch for news from your area.

- Help injured or trapped persons.
- Give first aid where appropriate. Do not move seriously injured persons. Call for help.
- Return home only after authorities advise that it is safe to do so.
- Inspect the outside of your home and surrounding area before attempting to enter. If you are unsure of the stability of the structure, DO NO ENTER.
- Avoid loose or dangling power lines and report them immediately.
- Check refrigerated foods for spoilage.
- Use telephone only for emergency calls.
- Stay tuned to local radio for information.
- Open windows and doors to ventilate and dry your home.
- Beware of snakes, insects, and animals driven to higher ground by flood water.
- Take pictures of the damage, both of the house and its contents for insurance claims.
- Drive only if absolutely necessary and avoid flooded roads and washed-out bridges.

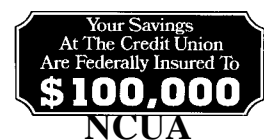
